Counseling Updates/Accreditation

Districtwide Counselor Debrief:

- Counselor majority seemed to like once a year instead of twice a year, virtual format is preferred. Might be hard to plan for hybrid
- Academic advisement is confusing, some are unsure how to use it and have stopped. Co-Chairs will look into asking Dr. V for training.
- Timing was off since it was the last day for extended deadline Co-Chairs explained the time was set before A&R announced deadline

Review Math Chairs Guided Placement - guide was reviewed with changes and counselors accepted the new guide. Co-Chairs will email the Math Department to see if this will be posted on the department website and catalog.

Dreamer Liason and Specialist, first generation student

Supports Undocumented Community Resource Center (enrollment and financial aid) Wants to support undocumented student clubs

Free immigration - free consultation, daca renewals

Undocumented students do not qualify for federal aid which includes FAFSA, Pell Grant, Work Study , but can get California Dream Act Application (State Aid)

Try and use more inclusive language if have you completed FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application instead of saying only FAFSA when talking with students

Dream Services Incentive Grant- undocumented students can try and get paid to volunteer

Other resources in Bay Area: Dream SF Fellowship, UCLA Dream Summer, UCB Students will be paid 300 hours per academic year (150 hours for Fall, 150 for Spring) - \$4,500 once they complete this hours

76 students that qualify for CA Dream Act Application, but have served so many students at the other PCCD campuses

Give students "red know your rights cards"- she has extra if counselors need it Free immigration legal services for students, faculty, and staff

Immigrant Rising- great resources and provides free mental health for students Connecting students with UCRC

Basic Needs Coordinator, Center is open Monday-Friday She has a student team, 2 spanish speaking student workers and 1 chinese speaking Food pantry is every Thursday, also provides hygiene products Financial aid literacy series (Wed at 1 March 26, April 9, April 23) Real College California Survey - over 500 students have completed the survey Transportation Vouchers- gas card applications are currently capped Self care event and clothing drive happening in April

Still accepting clothing until April 11, needs masculine, mens clothing and childrens clothes, event is at the end of the month

Partnering with Oakland Museum of California - all Merritt staff/faculty will get free admission now until January 30, 2026.

Still doing ECMC grant- need to demonstrate need - lots of applications getting denied because they do not meet the criteria- students should read the directions Students can drop in and see Susana any time at the Basic Needs Center

Program & Committee Updates

<u>Curriculum</u>: Repeat information from Fall: The five degrees that have both a local and transfer version are: Anthropology, Business Administration, Early Childhood Education, Economics, and Mathematics. Local degrees have been approved to be deactivated for Fall 2025 because there is an ADT degree (except Child Development, will continue to have an AA degree). Students have catalog rights.

The motivation behind this is that as part of AB 928 (CalGETC), students who declare for a major will automatically be placed on the transfer associate degree pathway, if one exists, and would therefore have to opt out of that placement to enter the local associate degree pathway.

Graduation Committee: Let Lesley know if you want to participate in Graduation. They need help with set-up and walking the stage. Order cap and gowns for faculty by April 14th so it can ship to Merritt. Students will be able to attend informational sessions and will try to have 1 in person and 1 virtual. TBD, but might be May 1st and May 7th. SAS confirmed that they will be purchasing the cookies.
