Meet the indigenous BriBri people, search for sea turtles at Tortuguero, explore jungles, rivers and the active Arenal volcano.

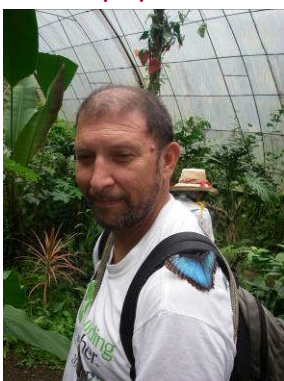

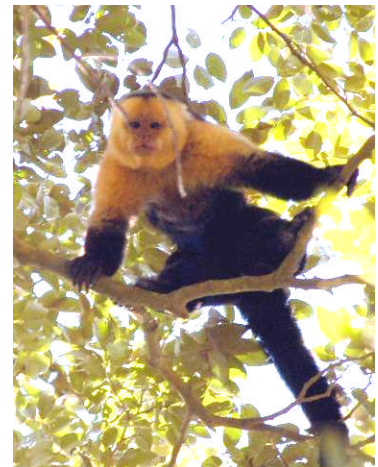

(*Ectophylla alba*)



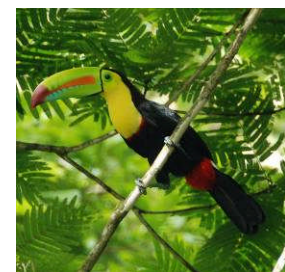
