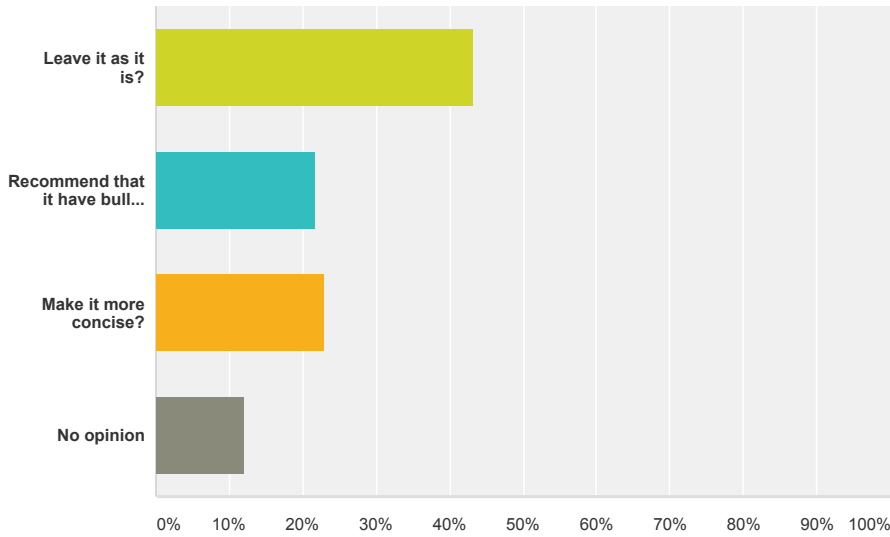

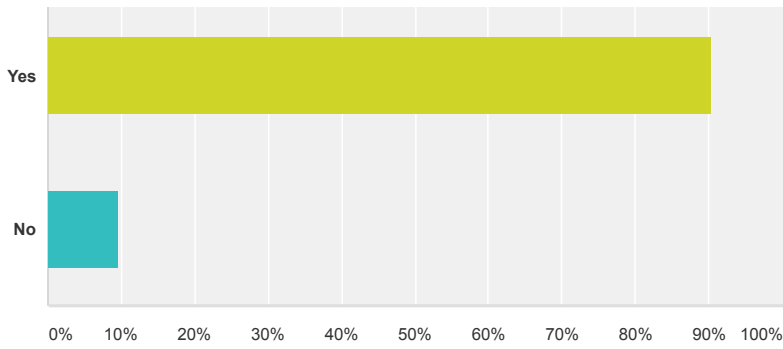

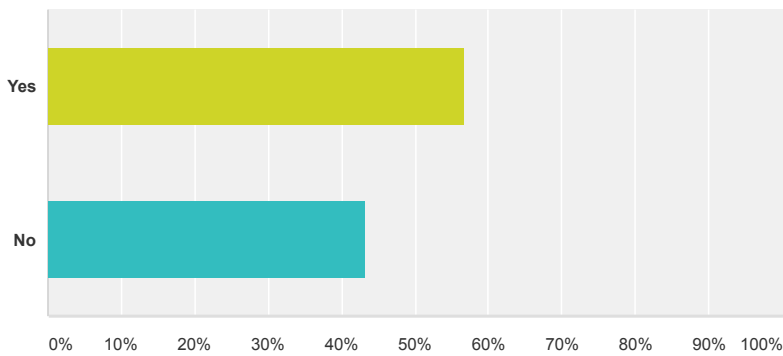

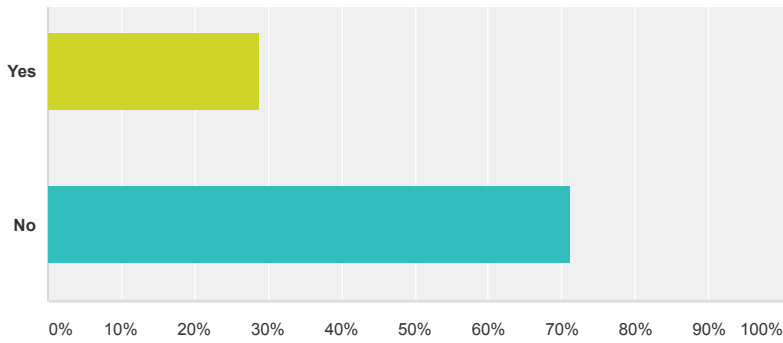

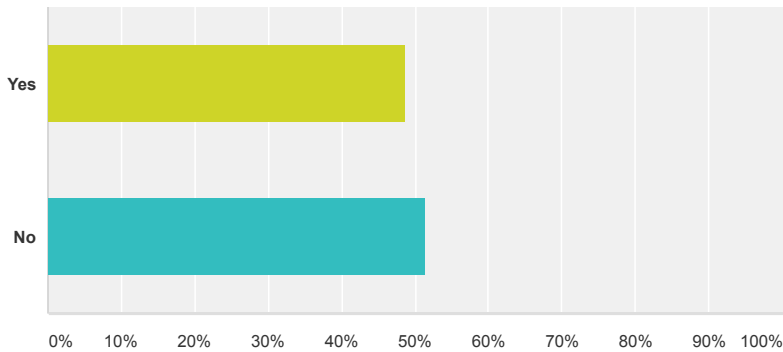

Answered: 74 Skipped: 0

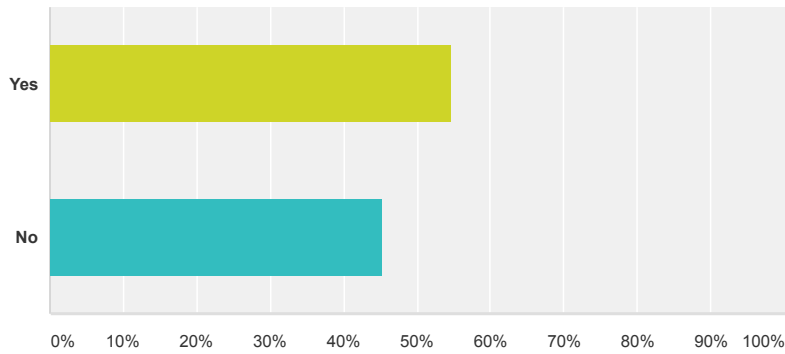
