
THE HOURLY MINUTE: NIA HILL

garden through her nonprofit, Nourish Wellness. In the
process of taking classes, Nia discovered her love for
nursery management. "This, coupled with my desire to
teach others, has made my school and work
experience here quite fulfilling." says Hill. And like so
many other classified who have found their way at
Merritt, she could easily see further fulfillment in a
permanent job here.

As the Hort Dept.'s substitute* Science Lab Technician and Nursery Manager, Nia feels a great connection to helping people in their education and does a beautiful job providing the ideal learning environment for growing and nurturing plants.

Nia can't help but to assist others in need. "We have leftover annual crops from our plant sales that we donate to food banks and school or community gardens. We've raised money for the Merritt Children's Center. Every semester there is an urban community gardening class, LH 501 (open entry/exit- sign up any time!), that grows produce and donates it to a center for the developmentally disabled (the fabulous Clausen House!- ed. note). These activities are along the lines of what I want to do with my nonprofit."

The biannual plant sales are a highlight too. I love seeing the range of burgeoning to professional gardeners eagerly browsing the plants. Our customers, (usually repeat), often remark on the wide selection and affordable prices".
