## OVERALL REQUIREMENTS

Candidates for the Associate Degree must complete at least 60 degree-applicable units which include courses in a Major, General Education, and Electives as necessary (see a counselor for details).

1. A minimum grade-point average of 2.0 ("C") is required in EACH of the following:

- Overall grade-point average and
- General Education requirements

2. A minimum grade of "C" or better is required in EACH COURSE in the major, English Composition (area $4 a)$ and mathematics (area 4b)
3. At least 12 units must be completed at College of Alameda
4. Students must complete General Education categories 1 through 5 below, at least 22 units of which must be completed in categories 1 through 4
NOTE: A course used to satisfy requirements in one category may not be used to satisfy a second General Education category, with the exception of the Ethnic Studies requirement (area 5).

## Graduation Evaluation

It is the student's responsibility to file a "Petition for an Associate Degree" by the deadline specified in the College Academic Calendar (available in the college catalog, class schedule or college's website). Students should file the petition once all course requirements are completed or final courses are in progress. Official transcript of any course work completed outside Peralta District must accompany the petition or be on file prior to requesting an evaluation. All out-of-district courses will be evaluated individually to determine if they satisfy COA's General Education requirements. Petitions are available at the Admissions and Records office and must be completed with a counselor. Counselors are available by appointment through the Counseling Department located on the first floor of Bldg A or 510-748-2209.
