California Community Colleges and Antioch University have joined forces so you can earn a bachelor's degree with 80 community college units.

Through the Antioch Bridge Program, you can earn a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies degree by completing 80 semester units from a community college or other institution, and the final 40 semester/60 quarter upper-division units from Antioch.

Why get a B.A.?

- Improved lifetime earning power.

Antioch Bridge Program Benefits

- The Antioch Bridge Program is both flexible and cost effective.
- Save money by completing 80 units at a community college and only paying university fees for your last 40 semester/60 quarter units.
- Classes can be taken on a full-time or part-time basis; Antioch schedules accommodate full-time or half-time students.
- Antioch course schedules are designed for working adults to permit you to study while employed.
- Math is no problem. You can complete all B.A. degree requirements without having to take a math course and there is no math prerequisite to enroll at Antioch.
- You earn your degree from a fully accredited, highly respected university with over 30 years of experience in providing quality Bachelor's and graduate level programs in Santa Barbara.

Here's how the program works

- Earn 60 transferable units of credit at a community college or other 4-year university.
- Apply for admission to AUSB, and, once admitted, complete an additional 20 transferable units at a community college OR transfer to Antioch.
- Take your final 40 semester/60 quarter credits of upper division courses from Antioch University Santa Barbara and earn a Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies.

Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies

The B.A. degree at Antioch University Santa Barbara is in Liberal Studies. Along with general studies, you may select an area of concentration that will prepare you for graduate work or career opportunities in a field of your choice. In addition to Business Management, Communication, Creative Writing, Liberal Studies, Applied Psychology, Social Service Administration, and Early Childhood Education concentrations, you also can create your own program to stretch your career in a new direction or fuel your enthusiasm for a specialized academic focus.

At Antioch, you can design a program as individual as you are. Together with a faculty mentor, you can combine areas and topics of interest to create a unique concentration all your own.

Field experience, internships, practica and independent study enable students to move beyond the classroom, to put theory into practice. In addition, students can earn credit for college level learning gained through life experience.

To ensure that B.A. degree is appropriate for your future career and educational objectives, we encourage you to meet with a career counselor before submitting your formal Antioch admission application.

Admission Requirements

If you have completed a minimum of 20 transferable semester units, you are eligible for admission to Antioch. It is recommended that students take at least 60 semester units and an additional 20 semester units at a community college. Courses with a "C" or better are transferable. Please consult a counselor for details.

Fees

You will pay whatever community college fees you would normally pay while you are completing 80 units. The final 60 quarter units cost approximately \$325 per unit depending on the number of units you take, excluding books.

Financial Aid

Opportunities are available to qualified students that can help make your B.A. more affordable. Talk to AUSB Financial Aid counselors to learn more.

Antioch Bridge Transfer Action Plan

I have fewer than 60 units:

If you are not currently enrolled in a community college, you will need to apply.

- Enroll in transferable classes.
- To make sure you are taking the right classes, meet with a counselor to develop a course plan and your transfer timeline.
- Once you have completed the 60 required units, submit the AUSB application.

I have already completed 60 units:

If you have already completed 60 units from another institution, you are ready to apply to Antioch.
