AFR Steering Committee Meeting, Wednesday October 18, 2015



The first AFR Steering Committee meeting convened on Wednesday, October 18, 2015. Forty-five participants were in attendance. After a warm welcome from Dr. Wise Allen, Interim VPI, Dr. Mia Kelly presented an overview of the definitions of ACCJC Sanctions, reiterating the urgency of Merritt's current Probationary Status.

Each of the Nine College Recommendation
Sub-Committee Co-Leads were then invited to
provide an update on their progress, share
strategies, and identify obstacles encountered.
These updates created an open, supportive
forum for dialogue and fostered a culture of
collaboration. Robust discussions also revealed
lessons learned from the past few weeks, and
increased understanding of accreditation
processes, guidelines, and procedures.

Dr. Audrey Trotter addressed Strategies for College Recommendation Sub-Committee Goal Achievement while also responding to questions revealed during Sub-Committee Co-Lead reports including:

- ⇒ Conducting an AFR Gap Analysis: What is the AFR gap analysis and how to conduct it?
- ⇒ What to do if the AFR Gap Analysis reveals the need to start over?
- ⇒ Where can I find the information needed to show how the College meets the Standards?
- ⇒ How to utilize the AFR Administrative Support Liaison to identify sources of information, or to clarify institutional processes and policies?
- ⇒ How to access College Shared Governance Committee By-laws and Archives?
- ⇒ What to do if information on institutional processes and policies is incomplete?
- ⇒ How to use evidence to support your writing response?
- ⇒ Links to successful ACCJC Community College Self Evaluation and Follow-Up Reports.

Jennifer Lough Kennedy, the AFR Writer/ Editor then presented and disseminated the AFR College Recommendation Writing Outline with an explanation of guidelines for beginning and completing the initial draft.

The next AFR Steering Committee Meeting will include detailed updates from Nghiem Thai, AFR Website Coordinator and Maril Bull, AFR Electronic Evidence Coordinator. All are encouraged to utilize the numerous resources on the Merritt Accreditation website, and AFR Co-Leads should submit College Recommendation Sub-Committee meeting minutes directly to Maril Bull (pictured below L to R with Kinga Sidzinska)



ACCJC Sanctions Defined



The criteria for the level of sanctions imposed by the ACCJC includes the following in order of severity:

- 1. Fully Affirmed Accreditation
- 2. Issue Warning— Sanction when ACCJC finds that an institution has pursued a course deviating from the Commission's Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, or Commission policies.
- 3. Impose Probation—Sanction when ACCJC finds that an institution deviates significantly from the Commission's Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, or Commission policies or fails to respond to conditions imposed upon it by the Commission, including a warning.
- 4. Order Show Cause— Sanction when the ACCJC finds an institution to be in substantial non-compliance with its Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, or Commission policies, or when the institution has not responded to the conditions imposed by the Commission.
- 5. Termination of accreditation—If, in the judgment of the Commission, an institution has not satisfactorily explained or corrected matters of which it has been given notice, or has taken an action that has placed it significantly out of compliance with the Eligibility Requirements, Accreditation Standards, and Commission policies, its accreditation may be terminated.
