AFR Steering Committee Meeting, Wednesday November 4, 2015

After a warm welcome and acknowledgement of the hard work of the Sub-Committees. President Dr. Norma Ambriz-Galaviz announced that the AFR Core Team was scheduled to present an accreditation progress update to the PCCD Board of Trustee's Meeting on November 10th

VPI Allen then addressed the need to update the Educational Master plan concurrently emphasizing that the External Evaluation Team did not find sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the College was actually following the plan. VPI Allen requested that every department update their section of the Master Plan

utilizing the Program Review Template and Annual Program Updates (APUs) to support the College Educational Master Plan. Currently, a special taskforce is being sought to lead the effort to update the College Education Master Plan. Meeting participants



were also reminded of the 4 critical institutional issues that must be addressed during the AFR process in order to create a successful response.

1. Integrated Planning and Budgeting

- 2. College Educational Master Plan
- 3. Student Learning Outcomes
- ...and the most recent critical Innitihha
- 4. The need to use data to drive institutional planning and decision making.

Instructional Deans have been assigned to three College Recommendation Sub-Committees each and will provide progress reports directly to the VPI.

Dr. Allen concluded the meeting with the announcement that an emergency faculty meeting on November 10th is scheduled to further discuss, critical issues. of encollment and Accreditation

An opportunity was provided for Co-Leads or representatives to share updates.

After sharing updates, two committees who have already submitted initial drafts provided the launch point for the discussion to address specific examples on conducting the



Gap Analysis and identifying specific strategies for the Written Narrative Responses.

Co-Leads were reminded to collate all individual submissions to create one unified document for submission to the AFR Team. The liberal use of tables and graphs was encouraged to provide schematic representations to ensure that Evaluators have ease in viewing the evidence. The submission deadline for initial drafts is Tuesday, December 1,
