- Course Completion (Success)
- Certificates
- Degrees
- Licensure Pass Rate
- Employment Rate

Institution-Set Standard A minimum performance standard we should not fall below.

Aspirational Goal: A performance level above the most recent year value which is set as a goal.

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Institution Set Standards (Annual)

Metric	Definition	Set Standard
Course Completion (Success)	tTe number of student completions with a grade of C or better divided by the number of student enrollments	66%
Certificates	Number of certificates earned in an academic year	222
Degrees	Number of associate degrees earned in an academic year	322
Transfer	Number of students who transfer to a 4- year college/university	187
Licensure (CE)	Examination pass rates in programs for which students must pass a licensure examination in order to work in their field of study	70%
Employment (CE)	The job placement rate of student completing a degree or certificate in a CE program in the year after graduation.	Macro-Region Employment Rate, by Program SOC

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
Degrees and Certificates

ISS = 66%



* UC and CSU figures are reported by each system office. ISP and OOS are from NSC.



Transferred to a Four-Year Institution

Among students in selected student journey who earned 12 or more units at any time and at any college and who exited the community college s year, the number of students who enrolled in a four-year institution in the selected year. If a student shows up as a transfer student in two different (i.e. CSU or UC and out of state) then that student is counted in both categories, therefore, summing the three transfer categories may not equal t







Largest Historical Increase Method for Setting Aspirational Goals: Highest Year-to-Year Change with 1% Increase as Minimum

For each metric...

- 1. Gather data over previous five years
- 2. Calculate year-to-year change
- 3. LHI = highest year-to-year change
- 4. Calculate LHI Goal = current year + LHI
- 5. Calculate Min Goal = current year * 1.01
- 6. Aspirational Goal = higher of LHI Goal or Min Goal

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Largest Historical Increase Method for Setting Aspirational Goals

- Multiplier for LHI
- Alternative values for minimum multiplier.
- Average rather than current year as base for goals.

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Alternative Methods for Setting Aspirational Goals

- Standard Deviation Method
 - positive: clearly defined methodology
 - drawback: very small sample size on time series limits inferential power.
- Average of Peer Colleges
 - positive: peer colleges
 - drawback: time consuming

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
