Chemistry instructor Jennifer Shanoski (pictured above, top left, with students) recently requested Modernist Cuisine: The Art and Science of Cooking for inclusion in our Professional Development Collection. She explains how this title will benefit her instruction and her students: "Last summer I received a scholarship to attend a weeklong workshop on Food Chemistry sponsored by the National Science Foundation. The PDC supported this effort by paying for my travel. My reason for attending this conference was that I want to develop a general education food chemistry course with the ultimate goal of encouraging a wider audience to learn about and love chemistry. 'Modernist Cuisine' is something of an encyclopedia of the science of cooking; it consists of six volumes that cover the techniques, history, and chemical processes of cooking. I will use these books to help develop my curriculum."


