

I have two part-time (49.5%) one year positions to help with a DNA barcoding project. One position includes setting out traps and collecting insects across different locations in Northern California. It would require two people travelling to sites and staying overnight at field stations or campgrounds. Travel expenses would be reimbursed. The other is working in the lab at UC Berkeley pulling legs from insect specimens for DNA extraction and recording data in spreadsheets. The positions pay ~\$25/hr (no benefits).
