- IV. IV. APU Template Nathan shared the APU template and the rubric SLOAC will use. We provided feedback on edits for the rubric and Heather will provide the final details after the meeting so it can be included in the APU rollout. We also agreed that all of the SLOAC coordinators will reach out to our respective division department chairs and program directors to provide support during APU completion.
- V. Fall semester planning
 - a. ACCJC Standards 1B1 and 1B2 updates
 - i. All coordinators working with Dept. chairs and program directors one on one to support their efforts in assessment work, with a primary focus on PLO assessment as this is an essential component of the APU process.
 - ii. We also agreed that while SLOAC will continue to track all SLO assessment, we will not track PLO/ILO/SAO assessment since this is a vital component of the APU and Program Review process and is where the evidence should be gathered. Our focus will instead be on supporting that assessment work and gathering of evidence for the APU.
 - iii. It was also suggested that it would be helpful to have examples of PLO assessment for departments and programs to reference (some using the SLOAC template, and other forms of evidence, such as department minutes or external accreditation reports).
